PLATYPUS NEWS & The Chris Rees Foundation



It's that time of year again when we invite those who have ridden with us previously to support the Chris Rees Foundation in Vietnam.

Some of you are new to Platypus and some won't even be riding for another 4-7 or 8 months so we are jumping the gun a bit, but it is a great cause and we scrounge annually around this time. You will not be bothered by regular calls, mail-outs or that stuff. We have a separate bank account for this purpose and we administer the funds directly.

For our newcomers, you riders support a veterinary student at university in far north Vietnam, around the area we normally ride through.

It is all done in memory of Chris Rees, who rode with us 3 times but was tragically lost in Southern Africa. The Rees family approves projects before we consider them; this young man, Pha, has done amazingly well and is currently being considered for a scholarship to either Denmark or Israel – it comes down to his English language proficiency it seems, We anxiously await his news.

Sung Thin Pha has completed year 4 and has done consistently well. His latest report shows: Law B, Infectious diseases B, Cat & dog diseases B, Veterinary internal diseases A, Intern A.

His semester GPA (?) mark is 8.09 out of 10. It does not mean a great deal to me, but it looks like 80%. If you thought riding a camel through the eye of the needle (or whatever) is tough, try vet science from the wrong side of the tracks in tough territory. Our lad is excelling. He plays a significant part in student affairs

and has already been offered a job after graduation. He will be a significant force for his ethnic minority clan.

Pha is Hmong, from a poor mountain family and had none of the advantages of the city kids (home computer, extra coaching, holiday work experience) and the better teachers are inclined to avoid remote areas where life can be pretty tough. I get a huge kick showing his annual report to a Kinh friend in Hanoi who once told me Platypus is wasting money educating the Hmong because they are "like animals". He didn't mean it unkindly, but it rankled!

We are passing the hat around in case you have a few spare coins looking for a really good home. Nobody is going to spike your drink if you pass on this occasion, and we do not expect you to sell your house for the cause. Mind you, should you do so we will happily bank the proceeds and send you a few blankets to keep out the winter cold. Never let it be said we are ungrateful!




AGM 13th AUGUST 2023 SANDALWOOD FACTORY FOR LUNCH

Three dedicated riders \rightleftharpoons rode to Cheynes Beach. There was Athol, Chris, Andrew, and in the sidecar was Jenny.





WA Veteran Vehicle Muster 3-5 NOV 23

<u>ANNOUNCING</u>: The Indian Harley Club (Bunbury) Inc and the Veteran and Classic Car Club of WA are jointly hosting the inaugural WA Veteran Vehicle Muster over the weekend of 3,4,5 November 2023 based in Donnybrook, WA. This event is for road-going Motorcycles, Cars and Other vehicles manufactured before 1919.

<u>AIM</u>: This event aims to bring together road-going veteran vehicle enthusiasts with various numbers of wheels for a weekend of social and riding/driving pleasure.

ROUTE FORMAT: The riding/driving involves three short loops out and back to Donnybrook for those capable of the miles and some optional even shorter cruises (within 15km radius) for the more elderly or infirm vehicles. Loops will include a rest stop at a local town or suitable venue where you can buy a coffee or self-cater. All corners will be marshalled and we have a cunning plan to keep the slow and fast vehicles separated.

Saturday morning's 70-75km loop is out for a morning tea stop and back to Donnybrook's main street for buy-your-own lunch.

Saturday afternoon's 70-75km loop will return to Donnybrook's town centre for an Historic Vehicle display before the evening's get together. Period dress is encouraged.

Sunday morning's single loop of 100km will include a buy-your-own brunch stop in a local town with return to Donnybrook for a late lunch and finish.

SOCIAL FORMAT: Saturday evening is the main get-together from 6PM for a group outdoor dinner, refreshments, story-telling and awards at Egan Park. (Sunset 6:46 PM). Just prior to this we have organised front row parking for Veterans in the town centre Historic Vehicle display from 4-6PM. Here we join in (period dress encouraged) and be amazed at the huge range of Veteran, Vintage and Classic vehicles on display. All Historic Vehicles welcome. For those planning to get to Donnybrook on Friday before the rally start, we have booked a few tables at the Donnybrook Hotel for the evening meal where we can make ourselves known to each other.

ACCOMMODATION: We have block booked the Donnybrook Transit Park at Egan Park for the weekend and will be using this as the rally base. There are powered and unpowered sites, only available by calling Apryl Longford at Donnybrook Shire 08 9780 4200 and quoting the <u>WA Veteran Vehicle Muster</u>. AFTER spending another unplanned night in Felixstowe my mate Chris drove to the hotel to pick me up and take me back to the warehouse on the wharf. It was a difficult place to find, but got there, disabled parking at the front door. Ralph was in his car!!!!! and lost in the English countryside while I was having a cold beer.

People there were great, as always, and we had a good night.

Next day 120 mile ride to Wales.

We were stuck in a bloody awful traffic jam on a motorway for two hours, I'd forgotten what it was like.

We stopped for a coffee half way and as I was about to hop on the bike when a lady in a wheelchair with MS came over, she was so



I've been asked if I would do a talk about my life, living with a disability etc at Cardiff University and a Cardiff High School. I'm hoping this will happen as I love speaking and informing people of what it's like living with a disability and how things can be improved.

It's hilarious watching the reaction of people to the Harley outfit, I've had plenty of photos and videos taken already, I'm loving it, especially when they realise I'm in a wheelchair, and hopefully opening their eyes

to see how life can still be lived, no matter what.

The weather has been great, although a bit cold for me, I got my beanie on, they're in shorts and t-shirts ha ha. So I got 5 more days of socialising in Cardiff before leaving for the TT.

I'm so lucky to be doing this trip. I'll do another instalment in a week.

IT'S BEEN a great stay in Cardiff, Ralph and Mo have been so hospitable. I've known Ralph since I was 14 and Alan and Hilary came over too, they were also part of the gang when we were young.

But in particular it's been so nice seeing my sister, Joan, and the rest of my Welsh family, it's been great with plenty of food, drink and laughter.

The weather has been fabulous, sunshine every day and it's so nice to be out on the bike, but I can't believe the state of the roads, especially suburban, they are so bad, deep potholes and rough. And the pavements are no better, I was told the main reason for people visiting the outpatients are broken ankles - no wonder!!!! We went for a ride on Sunday to the Pit Stop Cafe, next to an old race track, there were some of Ralph's mates there and a wide variety of bikes, good fun.

And my bike is causing a lot of attention as usual.

Ralph followed me to the Harley shop for a tyre and servicing etc, so I could be ready for the ride to the Isle of Man and the TT. Harley Davidson UK had informed the shop that anything I need, servicing, tyres, repairs they will do for free.

I'm very excited about going to the bike racing, although I'm really looking forward to meeting some of the people who have been in contact with me including others on sidecar outfits and riders like Christophe, a

disabled French rider who has no left arm, riding a modified Suzuki sports bike from Southern France, he's going for a ride around Ireland first.

There is an organisation called "Handicaps Motards Solidarite" in France which is a nonprofit organisation, modifying bikes for disabled riders and also helping get their modified bike licence.

One thing that's changed in the UK is men wearing shorts, and I've never seen so many tattoos, maybe that's why the shorts.

I forgot, in the UK, when someone stands still, a queue is formed behind them!!!

And I can't figure out when you're from a different speaking country, you've learnt English and you've arrived in Birmingham for example, how the hell do you know what they're saying, the accents are so strong.

I took the motorway to Liverpool, cruising along at 100km/h, nice and relaxing. Drivers are very considerate, joining the motorway from a slip road and they move into the next lane over to give you room.

Found the hotel I was staying, "The Titanic" easy, its right on the wharf, close to where I board the ferry the next day.

It's a very upmarket hotel, but I was getting treated like a celebrity, maybe cause I was the only one there in a hoodie, beanie and motorcycle boots.

The doorman said we'll make sure your bike is safe and put a fence around it for the night.

I was getting stuck into a cooked breakfast in the morning and thought maybe this isn't a good idea as I might be seeing it again on the ferry. Again, plenty of help in the morning even to the extent of holding up traffic at the entrance to the hotel so I could get out safely. *Cont'd back page*.
