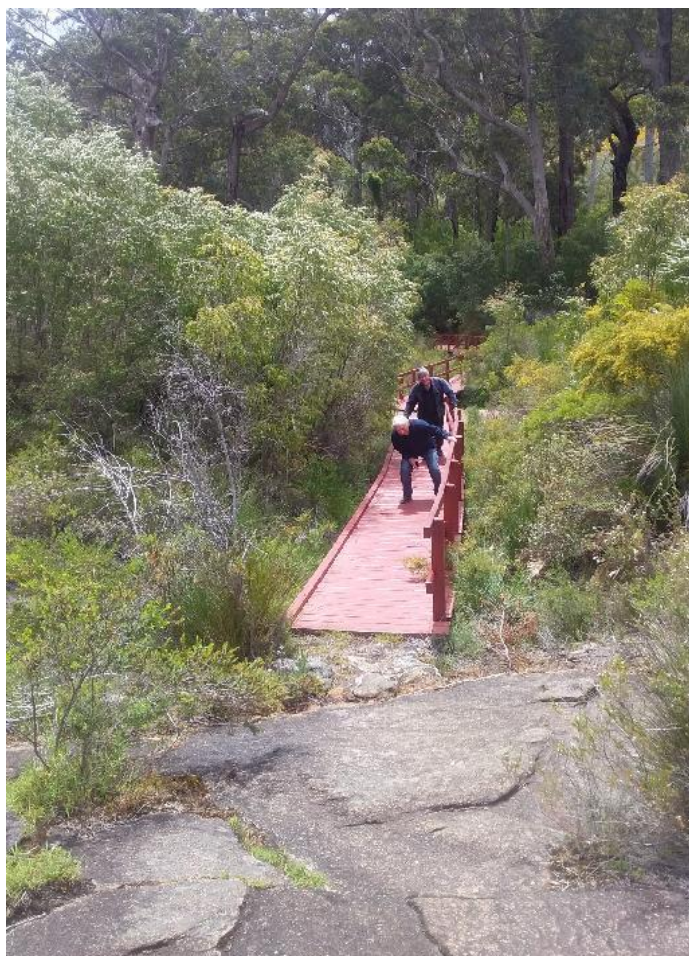

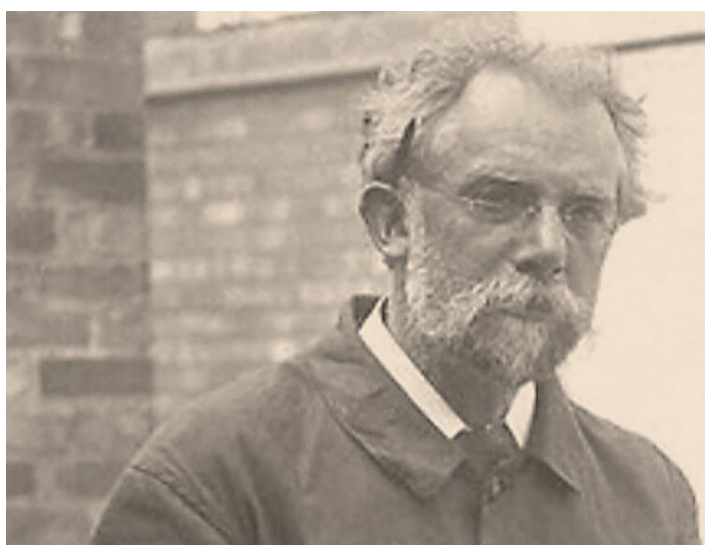
Nicola and I made some coasters including this photo of James Norton, as prizes for the quiz.

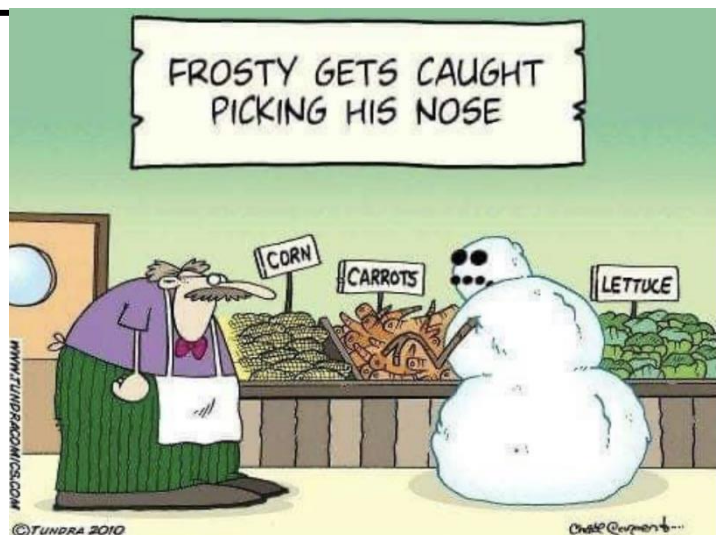
VIETNAM TOUR

Sunday saw an early start for a big crew of volunteers. There is so much to set up. This year we decided to hand over the job of road closures to the professionals. This took a lot of pressure off for everyone. It is one of the big, important jobs and needs a lot of manpower over the whole weekend.

But lots of volunteers got stuck into setting up the scaffolds, putting up banners, unwinding cables for the camera start and finish and getting the timekeepers set up, laying out the mats for the riders, putting up the marquees for the scorers and so many more jobs that are involved with this event. The Fire Brigade crew joined our lot filling water tanks and later manning their posts along the course. (They also helped at Saturday's rally handing out cards).

Petra and Ruth got busy about 6am and cooked up some fantastic bacon & egg burgers for all the workers. Just what was needed.

Then it was time for the competitors who arrived about 7am in time for the briefing by Steve.

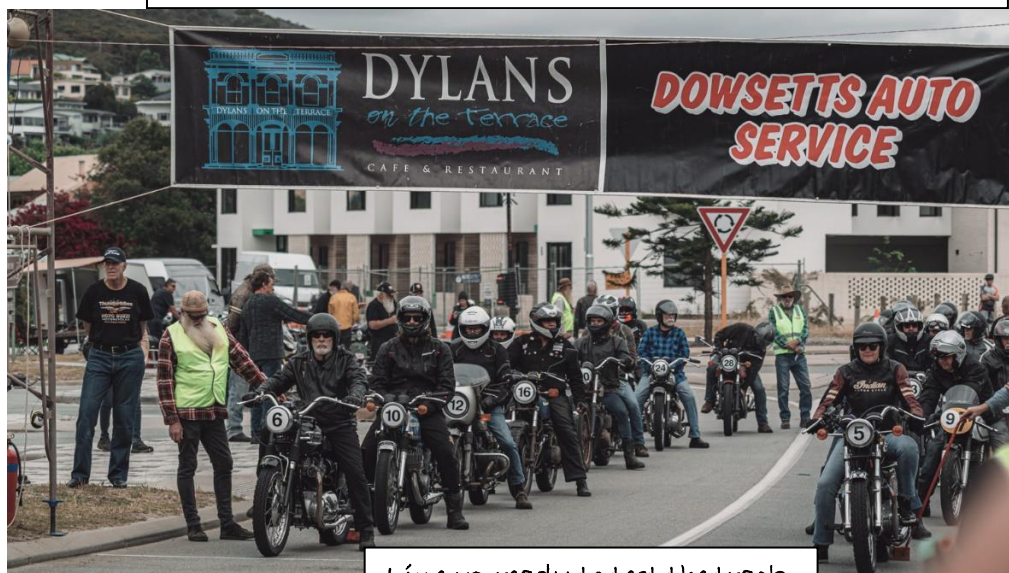
"This is not a race- Just you and the clock" called Steve. First trip up the hill was to check out the course. This one wasn't timed, and it was a spectacular sight to see almost 100 bikes ascend Marine Drive and oh the noise. Then down the hill they came, and it was time to get serious.

The riders go up in pairs and the first two runs gives them an idea of how long it takes to travel from the start to the finish. At the end of these rounds each rider nominated their time to the scorers, Leanne, Kerry and Trudy. They were very busy.

Then it was each rider's job was to do 3 trips up the hill in the same time that they nominated. The first two rounds are timed to the second, then last is to the tenth of a second. Scoring is done by counting the second above or below the nominated time.
