

Chester & I were taken by surprise when Kim presented us with life membership of the club. It is a great club to be a part of.



THE TRIPLES & GRAFTON RALLIES IN NSW

The 10th of August 24 was the day I set off for the Triple and Grafton rallies in NSW. The '75 Triumph Trident was serviced and cleaned for an 8:30 start to ride to Norseman. The weather good so what could

possibly go wrong? I had very pleasant ride to the first fuel stop at Jerramungup where I fueled up, had coffee, jumped on the bike but it wouldn't start. I pushed it away from the bowser, took all the gear of it to check the fuses. All good. Started testing connections with test light. After about one hour and help from Rupert, a local farmer with a multimeter, we found there was no power going to the electronic ignition. I hot wired to the battery and hay presto it started. I reloaded the bike and off I went. I'll find the problem when I am at the rally. The next fuel stop at Munglinup and all was well. As I left there, my phone loses its signal so no GPS, and I wanted to take the short cut to Gibson.

As I am riding I see a sign to Cascade so out with

the map. Yes, turn left here, right after Cascade and it cuts of a few kms (always put your glasses on when reading a map). Off l go along a good, sealed road and pass Cascade then a gravel road appears. Out with the map and glasses and can see it shown as a gravel road. While l don't mind a little gravel it doesn't look that far. No sign but l am sure it's the right road. After 30 kms l stop a ute coming the other way to make sure it's

the right road. Yes, stay on this road for another 50 km and turn left at the sealed road (not one of my best ideas). I get to Salmon Gums and pull into the servo for fuel and sign says "Sorry for the inconvenience but shut due to unforeseen circumstances". I haven't got enough fuel to get to Norseman and it's 5 o'clock already, so go to the pub to scrounge some fuel. Luckily the landlord had 6 litres which I bought to get me to Norseman. I arrived in the dark at 6:30 pm and this was first day. The next morning I met my friend Laurie from Perth with car and trailer at the BP at 7 to load my bike. Laurie and Eddie's bikes are in the trailer so three all up. Eddie is flying Perth to Brisbane and we all meet up at Evans Head for triple rally.

The trip across to NSW was good although my bike managed to break lose after a strap rubbed through on disc on another bike. Luckily there was a camera inside trailer so we stopped before there was any damage. We were going to a motorbike museum at Tamworth but managed to miss the town altogether. The Triple rally was over three days and was really well run by Col and Nancy McAndrew. 49 bikes were entered - not bad for just two models - BSA Rocket three and Triumph Trident from 1968-1976. Friday was a 180 km return trip to the Rappville Pub with Tooheys Old on tap for lunch, so want more could a man want?

It was a good ride through the cane fields and twisty roads with a few potholes, then back to base at the Evans Head caravan park.

I had worked out the cut-out switch on the handlebars was the problem on my bike which was fixed by David Wright, who knows Trident inside out and does YouTubes with his brother Ian on rebuilding them.

Saturday morning was judging for bikes and then a 220 km ride to Lismore Workers Club. The sun was out and no mishaps. There were a couple of bikes on the recovery trailer but our three were behaving. Saturday night was Presentation and Auction Dinner which is always good fun as the auctioneer is a crack up, with all proceeds going to charity. Some of the bikes are better than new so trophies were a little thin on the ground for us.

Sunday was a bike display at caravan park which quite a few people came to see and then a 100 km ride and a farewell barbecue.

We had four days off before next rally, so l rode to the Gold Coast and visited Chris' sister and had a look around. Went to Waterworld™ then rode up the coast. This was really nice but l think it would get very crowded in summer. The next day l rode up to Gatton to visit another friend which is about another 400 km into Queensland (Probably felt that far coz of the bike - Ed.). It was nice and green and really hilly countryside when l first left Gold Coast, and then just all flattened out you can see why it floods when the bad storms come in but we'll worth a look. Stayed at my mates overnight and then headed to Grafton for next rally.

Meet up with Laurie and Eddie at the Crown hotel on Thursday night. The Friday ride was about 80 km ride and like the triple rally was well organised ending at a park for refreshments. I didn't count them, but I would say about 50-60 bikes were there. Saturday was the main day with 100 or so bikes old and new, but there could have been more. Lunch was in a country town Hall and was fantastic with so many cakes and sandwiches, coffee and tea. I was lucky my tyres didn't burst on the way home (with all the food and beer probably carrying a spare by this time – Ed.).

Saturday night was really good with dinner at the Grafton Leagues Club - lots of raffles and trophies and a couple of beers.

We didn't do the Sunday ride as Laurie wanted to get home to his family, so we left Sunday morning. Eddie headed for Brisbane airport, while we headed for the Nullarbor. Driving through the night we got to Norseman by 8pm Monday night. I stayed at the pub and Laurie carried on to Perth.

I rode home the next day not taking any gravel roads which was good as it rained and blew a gale most of the way.

I would like to thank all the people who organised the rallies and made the food and donated the prizes. You did a fantastic job.

Also, thanks to John Davis who welded up my luggage rack after it fell apart after the 80 km of gravel.

PS the battery packed up as well, but I didn't want to tell anyone in case you might think the bike isn't reliable.


Then we were off to the boat ramp on the Wilson Inlet on the way to Anvil Beach for lunch.

Three road ride - 24th November 2024

Then head down to Spencer road and proceed to DenBarker road and turn right and head to Muir Hwy. Turn right and head towards Mt Barker.
